A SMALL INSTRUMENT'S BIG TIME

Get your uke on at the inaugural UkeFest Virginia. Ten groups with ukuleles will cover a range of genres during the two-day event, held Nov. 2 and 3. Besides concerts, uke enthusiasts can participate in workshops and jam sessions. Performers include the Aloha Boys — Hawaiians who settled in Washington, D.C., and in 1996 formed a band to show off the versatility of their homeland's prominent instrument. Amy Ferebee, a folk and jazz musician who plays mandolin and guitar, took on the ukulele before its current popularity. Also on tap are the Bumper Jacks (*below*), who have wandered through genres from hip-hop to ragtime, and Richmonder Samson Trinh, a composer and bandleader who started the Glen Allen Elementary School Ukulele Ensemble.
